Where: Abolition Lab in Seymour Library



Apply for a Conference Travel Allotment (CTA) to support your travel to a professional conference. You can apply now via the portal for the 2024-25 academic year (July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025). Funding varies based on your role at the conference and the conference location. The college does its best to support as many faculty members as possible going to at least one conference a year.

The Faculty Resource Committee, which combines the work previously undertaken by the Cultural Events Committee (CEC) and the Committee on Faculty Resources (CoFR), regularly reviews applications to support faculty research and creative work and makes recommendations to the Provost regarding support for the applications.
